LOS ANGELES CHAPTER 42 SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

Los Angeles Chapter #42 of the National Association of Women in Construction will annually seek scholarship candidates who possess a commitment to obtaining an education leading to a degree through a course of study in construction. Such degrees or associates degrees shall be in construction, civil, structural, mechanical, or electrical engineering, architecture or other construction-related careers.

Total scholarship award(s) shall not exceed seventy-five percent (75%) of the total Scholarship Fund account balance as of January 1st of each year (rounded to the nearest one hundred dollars). Total scholarship award(s) shall not be less than One Thousand Dollars (\$ 1,000.00).

All applicants must have a 3.0 (B) grade point average.

Scholarship(s) will be granted through any accredited College or University Financial Aid Office. The scholarship grant shall be applied towards the cost of tuition and/or course expenses as selected by the recipient(s), said amount not to exceed scholarship grant.

The Los Angeles #42 Scholarship Committee will review all applications. Appointments for personal interviews will be arranged. Complete applications, current official academic transcripts and the Scholarship Committee must receive scholarship resumes no later than the stated deadline on the application of each year. Applications received after the stated deadline will not be considered. The Scholarship Committee will select a recipient(s) no later than end of April of each year and present the recipient(s) to the Board of Directors no later than the May Board Meeting. Following Board approval, applicant(s) will be notified of the Committee's decision.

Scholarships are not automatically renewed, but the student will be considered for subsequent awards if she/he provides evidence of continued need, continued interest in construction, continued enrollment, and good standing in the college program leading to a degree in construction. Prior scholarship recipient(s) must reapply annually.

Scholarship recipient(s) must maintain a 3.0 (B) grade point average. Official academic transcripts must be submitted to the Scholarship Committee each grading period. Scholarship recipient(s) must maintain contact with Los Angeles Chapter #42 throughout the year and, when possible attend certain chapter functions.
